- What is the purpose of the study?
- What kinds of tests and treatments does the study involve?
- What is vorasidenib?
- What criteria do I need to meet in order to join the INDIGO Study?
- Will I know whether I am receiving vorasidenib or a placebo?

## Questions About Participating

- How long would I be participating in the INDIGO Study?
- What is Informed Consent, and what would I be consenting to?
- If I choose not to participate, what are my other choices?
- How might the INDIGO Study impact my daily life?
- Where is the closest INDIGO Study site? Is there any support available to me and my family if I need to travel to participate?
- Will I have to stay in the hospital?
- Will the study cost me anything? Will any of the treatment be free?
- Does the study involve some type of long-term follow-up care?
- Can I stop participating in the study at any time?
- If I have questions about the trial, whom can I contact?

## Questions About the Potential Benefits and Risks of Participating in the Study

- How will I know if the treatment I'm receiving in the study is working?
- Will I have to change my daily activities or my diet?
- How could participating in the INDIGO Study impact my disease?
- What are the possible risks of participation?
